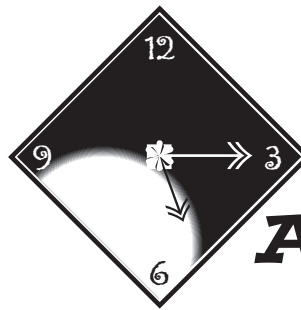

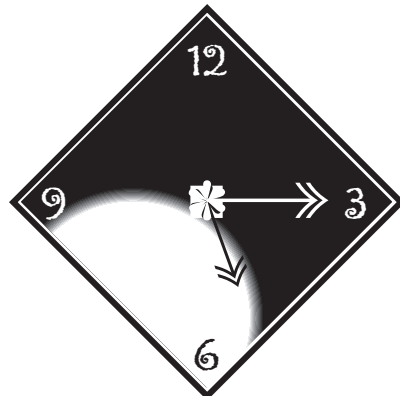

Two Weeks in Turkey

For millennia Asia Minor has been a crossroad between Europe and Asia. This geographically diverse region has been home to the Hittites, Greeks, Romans, the Byzantine Empire, the Ottoman Empire, and modern Turkey. OLLI affiliates Van Harrison and Bill Roberts will take us on another of their popular visits to a foreign country. Our travels start at the capital, Ankara, in central Turkey. We journey south to Cappadocia, land of "fairy chimneys," then on to the Mediterranean for a three-day cruise on the Turquoise Coast. We next travel west and north along the coast, visiting several ancient cities; e.g., Perge, Xanthos, and Ephesus. The trip concludes with four memorable days in Istanbul, seeing great monuments and art of the Byzantine and Ottoman Empires. *Wednesday, May 2, 7 p.m., at the Turner Senior Resource Center**

Osher Lifelong Learning Institute at U-M offers exciting opportunities to meet interesting people while enjoying the Ann Arbor area's numerous entertainment, dining and cultural events. If you or someone close to you aged 50+ cannot attend OLLI's programs during the workday, this is an opportunity to go to enjoyable events at other times with a group.

For an annual fee of \$15, you can join About Town and go to any or all of the events and bring a guest. If you wish, you can meet the group for dinner at a nearby restaurant prior to an event. Many events are free and others are reasonably priced. When there is an admission fee or restaurant bill, you must pay for it on your own.

Your \$15 fee covers organizational costs that enable you to join these activities. After registering, you will receive frequent e-mails announcing upcoming events. All regular communication is via e-mail. Members are expected to have access to e-mail service.

The events currently planned include:

- **Plays at Performance Network.** We will attend the Pay-What-You Can preview on the first Thursday of each play (\$10 recommended). Sharon Quiroz will send e-mail announcements of upcoming plays and dinner arrangements. - **All That Jazz.** Join jazz enthusiast Dale Magee for frequent gatherings at jazz clubs in the area. You can

enjoy bands such as the Easy Street Jazz Band, the Paul Keller Orchestra and Phil Ogilvie's Rhythm Kings. The cover charge is generally \$5 -\$10.

- ♦ **Concerts at U-M.** We have access to some of the best orchestras and bands in the country. Most of their performances are free with open seating. Concerts continue through the end of the semester. You will be notified about specific concerts as they develop.

- ♦ **Kerrytown Concert House.** Enjoy exceptional vocal and instrumental music in an intimate atmosphere. We will inform you of the upcoming performances. Most concerts are about \$15 for general seating.

- ♦ **Sip and Savor.** Join About Town members for tastings and cultural histories of food and wine at some of Ann Arbor's fine restaurants. The first event this fall will be at the Bell Tower Hotel on October 8, 3-4:30 p.m. Cover is \$30. Other sessions are being planned.
